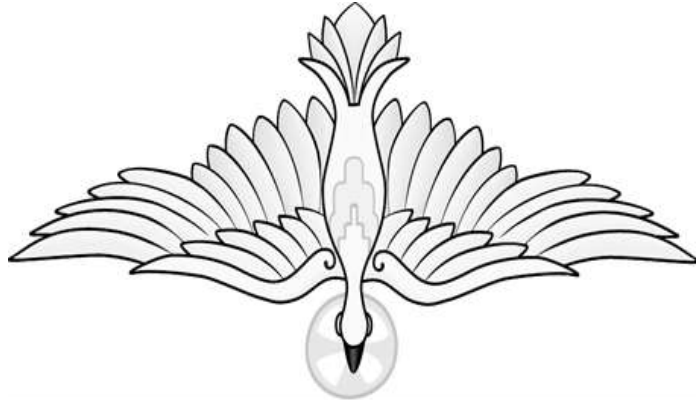

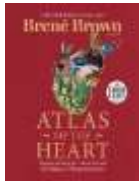
Today’s Liturgy
