

#### Nominees for Board of Deacons and Session

Cindy Burt: Board of Deacons I have been a member of Old First since 1973, where I was married in 1975. Initially, I was attracted by the music programs—concerts and the choir. I have sung in the choir ever since then and volunteered for Old First Concerts for 40 years. It has been my privilege to serve as both an elder and deacon for multiple terms.
