Today's Preacher: Cornel Barnett

The Reverend Cornel Barnett, D. Min., is Pastor Emeritus of Redwoods Presbyterian Church, Larkspur, California, where he served for eight years before he retired from fulltime ministry in 2016. He lives with his wife, Suellen, in Point Richmond. In his thirty-one years of ministry, Cornel has served Presbyterian churches throughout the San Francisco Bay Area, on Staten Island, New York and in Jacksonville, Florida.

Before his call to ministry, Cornel was a journalist for South African newspapers. He represented South Africa at the World Surfing Championships in 1966 and wrote the first book on surfing in South Africa. He also served as an international election observer in South Africa and Mexico. He met Suellen, a US citizen, in South Africa. They have been married for 50 years and have two children, Anna and David.

Cornel is a former interim pastor of Old First and is our preacher today – part of our series inviting former pastors, interim pastors and seminary interns to preach for Old First as we celebrate our anniversary and 175 years of ministry "on our corner, in our city, and in the world."
