Today's Worship Service: International Holocaust Remembrance Day

Today's service was inspired by the International Holocaust Remembrance Day service on January 27 hosted by the Russian-Speaking Jewish Community on Geary Boulevard, which I attended.

In 2005 the United Nations called for an International Holocaust Remembrance Day to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the liberation of the Nazi concentration camps and the conclusion of the Holocaust. The Secretary General said, "The International Day in memory of the victims of the Holocaust is thus a day on which we must reassert our commitment to human rights. We must also go beyond remembrance, and make sure that new generations know this history. We must apply the lessons of the Holocaust to today's world. And we must do our utmost so that all peoples may enjoy the protection and rights for which the United Nations stands."

I am thankful also for resources about the day shared by the Reverend Doug Huneke, Pastor Emeritus of Westminster Church in Tiburon. Doug was my campus pastor at the University of Oregon and first introduced me to Holocaust studies, and shaped how I came to understand God in a world filled with darkness and evil but also light and hope.
