The San Francisco Night Ministry, by Barry Clagett

Old First Presbyterian Church has supported the San Francisco Night Ministry for at least thirty years that I know of as a part of the church benevolence ministry and by providing church members who have been crisis line counselors or Night Ministry governing board members. Roger Lindahl, Phil Pollock and Carol Carter were board members for many years and Roger was President. Betsy Chiao and Linda Reyder have been crisis line counselors. Mary Russell has long been a Night Ministry supporter in her role on the Mission Committee. I am a crisis line counselor and board member at present.

My work with the Night Ministry has been a continually rewarding experience for fifteen years. This work follows Jesus' teachings to help people in need regardless of who they are. It is satisfying because it provides the opportunity to help people in all kinds of distress. It seems like there are an infinite variety of concerns. Frequently telephone friendships develop with callers and we talk many times over the years. Each night after I go off duty I feel like I've done something really worthwhile.

Mission

The San Francisco Night Ministry provides middle-of-the-night compassionate, non-judgmental pastoral care, counseling, referral and crisis intervention to anyone in any kind of distress. Through our crisis telephone line staffed by trained volunteer crisis line counselors and through person-to-person encounters with clergy on the streets, this ministry is available every night of the year from 10 pm to 4 am. When requested, the Night Minister will meet anyone, in person, anywhere in San Francisco. Calls to the Night Ministry Crisis Line come from the entire Bay Area and beyond. Everyone is eligible for assistance regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, life style, social or economic status, religion or no religion. The Night Ministry also provides an open-air worship service which includes preaching, praying, singing and Holy Communion each Sunday at 2 pm at Leavenworth and McAllister near United Nations Plaza.

Crisis Line Counseling

Crisis line counselors take calls from 10 pm to 2 am. Like the Night Ministers on the streets, they listen, talk with callers, share resources and offer referrals as appropriate. A live answering service takes calls from 2 am to 4 am and refers them directly to the Night Minister on duty. All contacts, by telephone or on the streets, are confidential. Crisis line counselors are carefully selected, screened and thoroughly trained. They may volunteer for one or more nights a month.

The Night Ministry seeks mature, sensitive crisis line counselors who are emotionally capable of dealing with the diverse problems encountered on the phone. Their ministry is as rewarding as that of the Night Minister on the street. There will be a meeting for potential Crisis Line Counselors Nov. 9, 2012 at 6:00 pm. World Communion, Peacemaking Offering, Heritage Sunday, Pastor's Return, October 7

Next Sunday we will observe World Communion Sunday, gather our Peacemaking Offering, enjoy a Heritage Sunday Potluck luncheon, and welcome our pastor, the Reverend Maggi Henderson back from her sabbatical.

World Communion Sunday

On October 7 we will join in World Communion Sunday, a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.

Peacemaking Offering

One of the annual special offerings in the Presbyterian Church (USA), the Peacemaking Offering is received every year on World Communion Sunday. This offering is divided; 25% is retained by each local congregation for a project of their choosing, 25% is used by synods and presbyteries, and 50% is used by the General Assembly, all to support peace in some way in many places. Local congregations have used this offering to support veterans and women's shelters. The General Assembly has prepared many more materials on the subject available to congregations, as well as support for peaceful efforts in very *unpeaceful* areas of the world.

Organ Concert, October 27

Marie Louise Langlais is the widow of the late organist, composer (and student of Marcel Dupre) Jean Langlais, who served as *organiste-titulaire* at the Basilica of Sainte-Clotilde at Paris from 1945 until 1988. The late Kenneth Matthews, who served Old First Presbyterian Church as music director for a decade, studied with Langlais. She will play this concert in tribute to the memory of Ken.

Renowned as a master teacher, Mme. Langlais was appointed professor of organ at the Regional Conservatory of Paris (*conservatoire à rayonnement régional de Paris*) in 1988, and retired in the spring of 2011. Many of her students have been laureates in international organ and improvisation competitions. She has served on organ competition juries throughout Europe and Russia, and has performed and lectured around the world extensively.
