Being a Good Neighbor-Old First Adopts Two Storm Drains. Drain Dedication on April 22 Earth Day, Following Coffee Hour

There are many ways to care for your neighbors and adapt a drain is the latest way Old First Presbyterian is caring for those that live and work near the church. Anyone can come to the church, get the cleaning supplies and take care of "our drains." There are at least two other people in the church who are drain adopters in their neighbors. Maybe there are more? Join us for a brief drain dedication-see where the supplies are and learn how you can help. Check out the website below and watch at quick video about the program.

Why adopt a drain? In San Francisco, we have a combined sewer system that collects storm water and sewage in the same network of pipes. While the system is made to handle a significant amount of rainfall, in large rain storms when the system reaches capacity, some low-lying areas of the City, especially areas that used to be creeks or streams, can experience flooding and property damage. No sewer system, including ours, can be designed to manage all the storm water in all storms.

San Francisco's preventive operations and maintenance program includes inspecting, cleaning, repairing, and replacing aging sewers. Crews use specialized trucks and equipment to deep clean more than 5,000 of the City's 25,000+ catch basins each year, with a focus on low-lying areas of the city that are prone to flooding. The city also monitors weather forecasts carefully and when major storms are expected, it increases staffing and deploys strike teams to monitor areas prone to flooding, even at night and weekends. Keeping storm drains and catch basins clear of leaves and debris helps avoid flooding and enables storm water to drain properly. The city appreciates those who adopt drains to help keep the drains clear of leaves and debris, protect the environment and help minimize risk of flooding. Find a drain and sign up at this website:

Refugee Gift Card Drive

Double Your Impact with Old First's Gift Card Drive for Refugees. Gift cards are what the International Rescue Committee's Oakland office says are most helpful today: \$25 or \$50 Target, Food Maxx and Safeway gift cards for refugees who are already here.

Many refugee families who have been in the U.S. a few years live in poverty. Gift cards put money directly in their pockets. After years of being denied freedom of choice, they can shop and buy what they need. Gift cards also can help them learn how to shop and to become educated consumers.

You can contribute gift cards or money to buy them, whichever works better for you. If you would like to have a record of your contribution for tax purposes, you will need to write a check. Either way, Old First will *match your contribution to double our impact* up to a total of \$2,000! Please bring your checks or gift cards to church on June 17 or June 24. If you write a check, be sure to put "Refugee Gift Cards" on the memo line.

SafeHouse Exercise/Music Room


Old First member Jim Fagler recently received this note from SafeHouse:

San Francisco SafeHouse recently completed construction of their new multi-purpose room! This wonderful new space, sponsored by Old First Presbyterian Church, allows women a second community room to inhabit in the house. The room features a prominent exercise area, where SafeHouse women work on healthy workout habits with our volunteer Pilates and yoga instructors. In addition, there is a sitting area for relaxation and studying, as well as a section of the room devoted to musical instruments. To top it all off, they have added a donated wall-mounted TV which can be viewed while exercising or relaxing on the couch. One of the great things about adding a new community space is that it allows residents to spread out evenly in the house without feeling crowded, which will allow the organization to add two additional beds to the program.

February Session Meeting Report

- The Personnel Committee brought two motions before the group to amend the pastor's housing agreement concerning maintenance and to approve changes to the Personnel Handbook covering vacation benefits.
- Two written reports on the February 13 Presbytery Meeting were reviewed and discussed. It was noted that the next Western Region Presbytery Meeting will be on March 7, and Bill Campbell and Virginia Webb-Pekelnicky were commissioned to attend. Further it was noted that the next full Presbytery Meeting will be on Saturday, April 28 at Valley Presbyterian Church, Portola Valley where Dr. Tod Bolsinger, author of Canoeing the Mountains will speak. Bill Campbell, Linda Reyder and Priscilla Yu were elected commissioners and all elders, leaders and members were encouraged to attend to learn about becoming an adaptive congregation.
- The Christian Education Committee reported on the Lent Spiritual Practices discussion series. Publicity was encouraged and elders were asked to invite other members to attend.
- The Mission Committee reported on Using Old First benevolence funds to make matching grants, the February 7 Interfaith Welcome Benefit concert and the One Great Hour of Sharing offering on Easter Sunday. There was motion from the committee requesting approval to have a drive for gift cards for refugees; the motion passed.
- The Community Building Committee announced that the next meal would be the Easter pancake breakfast on April 1.
- The Planning Committee mentioned that the Nominating Committee was working, that the Pneu Activities Group learning about adaptive challenges and change was effectively working, and that online giving was moving forward.
- The Finance Committee reported that a Church bookkeeper had not yet been hired.

- The Operations Committee highlighted progress on signage updates, testing a new internet service, new lights installed on the chancel, new fixtures and sound system improvements in the Sanctuary.
