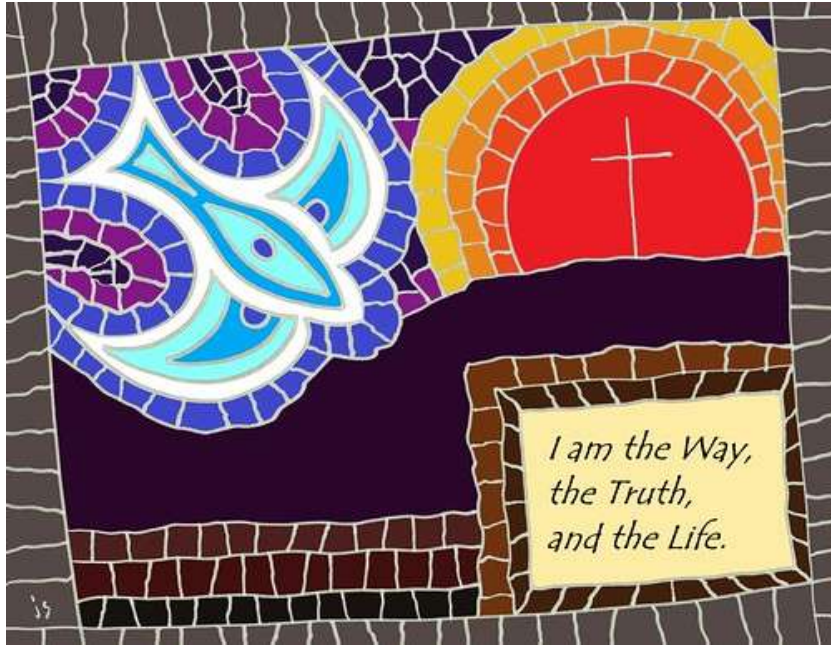

Moment for Mission: Old First Benevolences

Old First strives to practice good stewardship and tries to give 10% of our budget to other organizations working for justice and peace in our community and world. Over the next few weeks, we will have brief moments for mission in our worship services to tell us about some of the projects and organizations we support.



This week we will look at the Covenant Network of Presbyterians (CNP). This inclusive organization was born in this congregation in 1997 and was led by Old First's own elder, Pam Byers, for many years. Under Pam's leadership the organization was instrumental in changing the policies of the Presbyterian Church (USA) to welcome LGBT clergy and officers into ordained roles in the church. The mission of Covenant Network of Presbyterians is to strengthen the church by working for the full inclusion of LGBTIQ+ people in its life and leadership. CNP is a network of more than 400 congregations and thousands of individuals, all committed to celebrating the gifts and extending authentic welcome to people of all gender identities and sexual orientations. For over a quarter-century, our work has supported the Presbyterian Church (USA) through educational programs, resources for congregations and individuals, advocacy for church policy changes, and care and support for those facing exclusion and discrimination in the church.
