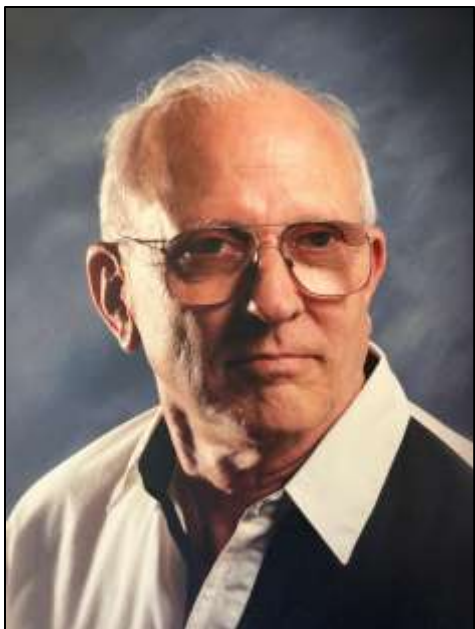

Glen Arthur Potter passed away peacefully at his San Francisco home on July 24, 2026, at age 95, surrounded by close friends.

Born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Glen served in the U.S. Army in Heidelberg, Germany, during the early 1950s. After a banking career in Tulsa and Minneapolis, he and his beloved partner, Steve Bacik, moved to San Francisco in 1971 and founded Accent on Flowers in Noe Valley, a neighborhood institution for many years.

Glen was known for his kindness, gentle humor, generosity, and extraordinary gift for friendship. A devoted member of Old First Presbyterian Church, he found joy in faith, flowers, and community.

Glen was preceded in death by his parents, Edward and Georgia Potter, by his siblings, Joel and Evelyn, and by his partner, Steve.

Glen is survived by his devoted cousin, Sue, by his nieces and nephew, and by many beloved great-nieces, great-nephews, and their families.
