Eastertide comes to a close with the Day of Pentecost, fifty days after Easter Day. Pentecost (which means 50 in Greek) celebrates the gift of God's Holy Spirit to the church. And since tongues of fire were one of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost, why not wear a touch of red when you come to worship on Pentecost, May 19.

Pentecost Offering 2024

The annual Pentecost Offering is one of the four special offerings received each year in the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Pentecost Offering helps our youth begin life with a strong start in the years from childhood through young adulthood – a strong start that supports a strong life.

The offering received is divided four ways:

- 40% stays with our congregation to support our own local ministries with children and young people.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Young Adult Volunteer program which serves communities around the world.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Presbyterian Youth Triennium.
- 10% supports at-risk children by improving education opportunities and safe havens.
