Pentecost Offering 2024

Today we receive the annual Pentecost Offering, one of the four annual special offerings in the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Pentecost Offering helps our youth begin life with a strong start in the years from childhood through young adulthood – a strong start that supports a strong life. The offering received is divided four ways:

- 40% stays with our congregation to support our local ministries with children and young people.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Young Adult Volunteer program, which serves communities around the world.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Presbyterian Youth Triennium.
- 10% supports at-risk children by improving education opportunities and safe havens.

This year the Mission Committee will donate a portion of the Pentecost Offering to the Boys and Girls Club, Tenderloin Clubhouse. The Tenderloin is home to more than 3,000 children, largely from immigrant families. The Tenderloin Clubhouse opened to 1996 and serves over 120 youth each day, many of whom live above the Clubhouse. The after school programs include: academic mentoring, college prep, creative arts, health and life skills, sports teams, job readiness, leadership programs and summer camp.
